<b>Abies koreana</b> <b>'Silberlocke'</b>	Slow growing, bushy fir with upswept needles that show the white underside, giving it a silvery appearance. Large purple cones in spring from a young age. 6-7ft in 20 years.	<b>£14.50</b>
<b>Abies nordmanniana</b> <b>'Pendula'</b>	Weeping branches sweep down in large cascades on this exquisite dark green tall Conifer. 8ft in 10 years.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Abutilon</b> <b>megapotamicum</b> <b>'Variegatum'</b>	Choice semi-evergreen wall shrub with strikingly golden variegated foliage and lantern-like flowers in red and yellow. Warm sunny wall. To 8ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Acacia baileyana</b> <b>'Purpurea'</b> AGM	Beautiful form of Wattle with finely bipinnate fern-like foliage. New foliage is deep purple contrasting with the glaucous older leaves. Only hardy in the most sheltered garden, but a good conservatory plant.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Abutilon 'Tango'</b>	<b>NEW!</b> Striking orange flared flowers on an upright shrub to 6ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Acanthus sennii</b>	A native of the Ethiopian Highlands, this rare evergreen has holly-like leaves and spikes of burnt orange flowers are produced in late summer and autumn.. Scrambling habit. Grows well in containers. To 6ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Acanthus spinosus</b>	A plant of classical beauty. Great basal clumps of dark shiny green, deeply divided spiny leaves, topped by stout spires of hooded foxglove flowers in Aug/Sept. To 5ft. Of architectural value. Prefer sun and soil not too damp.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Acer campestre</b> <b>'Evenley Red'</b>	Amazing new find. This has all the robustness and ease of growing of the native Field Maple but colours bright red in autumn. Train into a small tree or large shrub. Takes regular pruning. Will grow on heavy clay.	<b>£30.00</b>
<b>Acer griseum</b>	Cinnamon coloured peeling bark. Good autumn colour. Slowly grows into a small to medium sized tree. Stunning!	<b>£30.00</b>
<b>Acer palmatum</b> <b>'Dissectum'</b>	Beautiful form of Japanese Maple with pale green lacy filigree foliage on a small mushroom-shaped bush .	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Acer palmatum</b> <b>'Garnet'</b> AGM	Finely divided rich purple foliage retains its colour all season. Small slow growing bush, like the above.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Acer pseudoplatanus</b> <b>'Brilliantissimum'</b> AGM	Remarkable small tree, grafted on a 5ft stem. Forms a neat bun-shaped head. Leaves open bright shrimp-pink, change through reddish pink to orange, to yellow fading to white and then turn dark green, the colour changes last for 2 months. Invaluable for brightening a corner. Hardy, undemanding and good in shade. Available in 2 different stem heights.	<b>£35.00</b>
<b>Acer shirawanum</b> <b>'Jordan'</b>	Soft yellow leaves held in 'clouds' on an elegant large bush. Very slow growing. Hardy but requires a site sheltered from cold spring winds.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Acer rubrum</b> <b>'Summer Red'</b>	New form with leaves emerging in spring flushed red and staying red all summer until a final autumnal display.	<b>£35.00</b>

<b>Aconitum hemsleyanum 'Red Wine'</b>	A climbing Aconitum. Planted near early flowering shrubs it will scramble through them to produce the typical hooded flowers deep purple in late summer.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Acorus gramineus 'Ogon'</b>	Graceful arching grass-like plant with unusual one-sided tufts of foliage brightly striped gold and cream. Compact to 12 inches. Easily grown.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Actaea</b> - includes former <i>Cimicifuga</i> species	Woodland dwellers with handsome, deeply divided foliage and spires or clusters of white or pink flowers. Some species have spectacular berries.	
<b>Actaea rubra</b>	An elegant clump of finely-cut foliage producing fluffy white heads of flowers followed by spires of pea-sized glistening scarlet berries. 3ft. Cool shaded position.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Adiantum aleuticum 'Imbricatum'</b>	Hardy North american species with dense pinnate fronds on wiry dark stems. Delicate in appearance but very hardy.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Adiantum venustum</b> AGM - <b>Himalayan Maidenhair Fern</b>	Small classic Maidenhair Fern, with bronze tinted new growth which unfurl into bright spring green romb-shaped leaflets, which elegantly drape off thin black stems. Semi-evergreen and hardy. 6 ins. Good for a shady damp spot.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Aeonium 'Velours'</b>	Dramatic succulent bearing tightly packed glossy purple rosettes. Spikes of many yellow flowers on 2-3 year old stems in spring. Prefers sun or light shade and well drained soil. Hardy to 5°C, requiring winter protection. 2ft.	<b>£6.50</b>
<b>Aesculus parviflora</b> AGM	A large shrubby mound freely producing large white candles with whiskery red anthers in July/Aug. An excellent lawn specimen.	<b>£12.75</b>
<b>Agapanthus - Blue African Lily</b>	Mostly originating from South Africa, these lilies look exotic and extravagant in a border or in a tub. Stout stems support bunches of blue or white tubular bells well above rosettes of glossy green, strap-like foliage.	
<b>Agapanthus 'Black Magic'</b>	New, ink-black purple Agapanthus with dark pendulous buds. Deciduous. 3ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Agapanthus 'Enigma'</b>	Fascinating two-tone flowers, dark violet and pure white, on large flower heads over evergreen broad strap-like leaves. 2 ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Agapanthus 'Queen Mum'</b>	Big bold Agapanthus with large heads of creamy-white flowers which are blue at the base. Semi-evergreen.	<b>£12.50</b>
<b>Agapanthus 'Taw Valley'</b>	Intense dark blue flower umbels on a plant with slender leaves. Quite stunning! Deciduous, 18ins to 2ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Agapanthus 'Twister'</b>	Hardy bicolor Agapanthus with white flowers stained dark blue at the base. Semi-evergreen. 2ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Agave parryi 'Cream Spike'</b>	Charming miniature forming a rounded symmetrical plant with creamy white variegated leaves. Will not exceed 150mm diam. So is very suitable for pot culture.	<b>£6.50</b>
<b>Akebia quinata 'Amethyst Glow'</b>	Handsome climber with palmate leaves, brown-purple flowers and peculiar light violet sausage-shaped fruits. To 30ft.	<b>£12.50</b>

<b>Albizia julibrissin f. Rosea</b>	Forms a small tree with powdery pink flowers in summer. Handsome pinnate foliage. Takes some years to flower and requires a sunny sheltered site.	<b>£12.50</b>
<b>Alchemilla erythropoda AGM</b>	Charming miniature Lady's Mantle with silvery leaves and sprays of acid-yellow flowers. 3ins	<b>£6.50</b>
<b>Alchemilla mollis AGM</b>	Attractive rounded downy leaves topped by lax long-lasting feathery sprays of yellow stars. Easily grown and very effective ground cover, sun or shade. 18ins by 2ft spread.	<b>£6.50</b>
<b>Allium Millenium</b>	New form. Summer flowering with many heads of pink flowers. Foliage still looks fresh and green when flowering giving a very neat appearance.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Allium ursinum</b>	Wild Garlic. Beautiful naturalised on well drained soil in part shade. Good used in cooking but also attractive in flower.	<b>£5.00</b>
<b>Alnus glutinosa 'Imperialis'</b>	<b>Fern leafed Alder.</b> Slow growing, elegant slender tree, perfect for a normal to wet site. Leaf is elegantly shaped, with deep fringed lobes. To 12 m.	<b>£35.00</b>
<b>Aloe cosmo 'Green Pearl'</b>	Globe-shaped succulent with darkest green fleshy leaves and a spire of red flowers in late summer. Really exotic looking plant that is not all that tender - survived with us this winter in an unheated tunnel down to -10°C!	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Alstroemeria 'Indian Summer'</b>	If you are looking for 'Shocking and Bright', this is it. Orange, yellow and red trumpet shaped flowers produced in abundance on stout upright stems with dark flushed foliage. Easily grown and effective in a pot. Sun or part shade.	<b>£12.50</b>
<b>Alstroemeria 'Rock 'n'Roll'</b>	<b>NEW!</b> Fantastically bright, clean white variegation offsets vibrant red flowers - an irresistible combination! Easily grown and robust, to 3ft.	<b>£12.50</b>
<b>Alstroemeria 'Sweet Laura'</b>	Sweetly scented warm bronze yellow flowers with darker markings. Moist but well drained soil, sun or part shade. 18ins.	<b>£10.00</b>

<b>Amsonia - Bluestar</b>	Slow growing, clump forming perennials from the US and S. Africa.	
<b>Amsonia 'Blue Ice'</b>	Compact plant with large bright blue flowers in terminal clusters. Long lived and trouble free. 18 ins.	<b>£8.50</b>

<b>Amsonia tabernaemontana var. salicifolia</b>	Pale blue heads of tubular flowers are produced in summer above narrow, willow-like leaves. Full sun or semi-shade. This species prefers moist soil. 2ft.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Anemone - Windflower</b>	A most diverse group of plants. Japanese anemones are tall growing, late flowering perennials, producing rounded blooms on wiry stems for weeks. Reliable and tolerant of shade and most soils. Other species, see description.	
<b>Anemone x hybrida 'Honorine Jobert'</b> AGM	Large pure white blooms with yellow stamens. 5ft .	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Anemone 'White Swan'</b>	Beautiful hybrid with one parent spring flowering and the other late summer. The result is flower all summer. White flowers with a blue reverse. Compact to 18ins.	<b>£12.50</b>
<b>Anisodonteia 'El Ryo'</b> - Cape Mallow	Prolific flowering Mallow, almost year round cover of dark pink saucer shaped flowers on a tall willowy plant. Sheltered sunny position. To 6ft.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Anthemis tinctoria 'E.C. Buxton'</b>	Showy perennial with daisy like flowers produced over a long period in summer. 'E.C. Buxton' is a cool lemon yellow invaluable for flower arranging. 3ft .	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Anthemis tinctoria 'Sauce Hollandaise'</b>	Creamy yellow daisies with darker yellow centres produced in great profusion all summer over a mound of finely divided dark green foliage. Sun and good drainage. 2ft.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Aralia cachemirica</b>	Large mounds of handsomely divided basal foliage and green flowers in striking umbels on an unusual and very rare large woodland perennial. 4-5ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Araucaria araucana - Monkey Puzzle</b>	Whorled branches radiate out from a strong central stem and are densely set with dark green pointed evergreen foliage. Easily grown and a good focal point in a garden. Slowly to a great height.	<b>£17.50</b>
<b>Arbutus 'Marina'</b> - Marina Strawberry Tree	A recently discovered hybrid with large evergreen leaves, large panicles of rose-red flowers and good shredding bark. Also grows vigorously. Hardy but best with good drainage.	<b>£30.00</b>
<b>Arbutus unedo AGM</b> - Killarney Strawberry Tree	Small evergreen tree, slow to 20ft. Bark gnarled, dark and shedding. White flowers in autumn, strawberry-like fruit. Plants trained on a single stem as a tree.	<b>£14.50</b>
<b>Arbutus unedo 'Roselily'</b>	Pink flowered form of the above.	<b>£20.00</b>

<b>Artemisia - Wormwood</b>	Valuable garden plants mainly grown for foliage effect. All require full sun and well drained soil and benefit from hard spring pruning.	
<b>Artemisia abrotanum AGM - Lad's Love</b>	Old cottage garden shrub. Planted by a path it releases it's sweet aroma when brushed. Grey-green soft filigree foliage. 3ft.	<b>£6.50</b>

<b>Artemisia ludoviciana</b> <b>'Valerie Finnis'</b> AGM	A beautiful form with broad jagged silver leaves . Vigorous and reliable. 2ft.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Arum italicum ssp. negl. 'Chameleon'</b>	<b>Jack-in-the-pulpit.</b> Particularly good form with large shield-shaped leaves having a silvered centre section.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Aruncus</b>	Handsome woodland perennials, that also thrive in the shady border. Leaves pinnate, of a fresh green, and flowers creamy white in airy, elegant sprays.	
<b>Aruncus dioicus</b> AGM	Forming a hummock of fem-like deep green leaves, topped by great creamy plumes of starry flowers in summer. Makes a fine specimen. 6ft high by 4ft.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Aruncus dioicus</b> <b>'Zweiweltenkind'</b> <i>('Child of Two Worlds')</i>	A more dense, tighter form with an overall brownish tone to the whole plant. As the name suggests, it has an ephemeral, shadowy character, with the whiteness of the flowers, that are produced later than the type, shining against the dark foliage .	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Aruncus 'Horatio'</b>	<i>A. aethusifolius</i> x <i>A. dioicus</i> . Bronze-tinted elegant foliage and creamy spires. Easily grown, undemanding, sun or shade. 2½ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Arundo donax - Spanish Reed</b>	A giant reed with elegant drooping blue-grey leaves on stems to 10 ft. Happy in most soils including very damp.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Arundo donax</b> <b>'Golden Chain'</b>	A tall grass with leaves striped boldly gold. A unique plant first named by Liam Mackenzie of Madrona Nursery.	<b>£16.50</b>
<b>Arundo donax</b> <b>'Versicolor'</b>	Beautiful variegated form with broad white striped leaves. Only hardy in the warmest gardens but makes a wonderful specimen plant in a large container. 6ft	<b>£16.50</b>
<b>Asarum europaeum</b> AGM	Glossy rounded evergreen leaves and a curious brown flower, much like an insect. Good for ground cover in shady positions. Invaluable under shrubs.	<b>£4.50</b>
<b>Asarum maximum</b> <b>'Silver Panda'</b>	Leaves overlayed with prominent silver markings.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Asclepias tuberosa - Silkweed</b>	Bright orange-red flowers produced in late summer. Prefers well drained soil in full sun and a sheltered position. 18ins.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Asparagus filicinus</b>	Finely cut mound of bright green foliage. Sun or shade where not too dry. 12ins.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Asparagus virgatus</b>	Upright stems of feathery leaves with white flowers and green berries. 2ft.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Asphodeline lutea</b>	Conspicuous rosettes of soft blue-grey grass-like foliage and tall spires of large starry warm yellow flowers in early summer, followed by long lasting attractive seed heads. Sun and drainage. To 5ft.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Aspidistra 'China Star'</b>	Neat glossy green leaves have many golden dots. Vigorous and will form a small patch under dense trees or shrubs.	<b>£8.50</b>

<b>Aspidistra elatior</b> AGM - <b>Cast-iron Plant</b>	Popular in Victorian times as a houseplant, tolerating well shady and dry conditions and very long lived. The broad evergreen leaves are also useful in the garden. Prefers a shady sheltered spot. 2ft .	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Asplenium ceterach</b>	Charming dwarf fern with narrow fronds Best on limestone rockery.	<b>£6.50</b>
<b>Astelia chathamica</b> <b>‘Silver Spear’</b>	Evergreen plant with bold spear-like leaves of a good silver in a central rosette. A striking accent plant and good in a tub. Grow in full sun to part-shade in humid but drained soil. Best in a sheltered spot or in a tub and move in for winter. 3ft.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Aster - Michelmas Daisy</b>	Indispensable late summer and autumn flowering. Easy to grow in sun or part shade and forgiving of soil.	
<b>Aster glehnii var. glehnii</b>	Large-scale perennial Aster with masses of small white flowers in large flowerheads over broad heart shaped leaves. Up to 7ft! Sun to part shade, not too dry.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Aster laevis 'Calliope'</b>	A lovely plant. 6ft tall with almost black leaves and stems and countless small blue stars appearing in autumn - a marvellous combination!	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Aster peduncularis</b>	Comparatively large blue flowers over broad leafy clumps Compact and very free flowering over the summer. Will even grow in part shade and dryish soil. 12 inches.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Aster tradescantii</b>	Tall erect stems clothed with narrow dark green leaves are topped by airy clouds of tiny white flowers with a yellow centre. Very late flowering contrasting well with red berries and autumn colour. 4ft.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Aster x frikartii 'Mönch' AGM</b>	The finest Aster. Beautiful rayed, clear lavender-blue flowers with golden eyes from July to October on stout upright branched stems. Best in full sun. 3 ft .	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Astrantia - Motherwort</b>	Dense clumps of fresh green divided foliage above which rise wiry stems topped by posies of pink or white florets with a pale green collar. Sun or part shade. Excellent for flower arranging.	
<b>Astrantia major 'Roma'</b>	New, very attractive Astrantia with large green veined pale pink collar and a swarm of rose pink star-shaped flowers. Very free flowering. 18ins.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Athyrium nipponicum pictum AGM - Japanese Painted Fern</b>	Beautiful fern with wine-red leaf stalks and metallic grey-blue fronds. 2ft.	<b>£6.75</b>
<b>Athyrium vidalii</b>	Upright deciduous fern with gold flushed new fronds which are finely cut and have a red midrib. 12inches.	<b>£16.50</b>
<b>Aucuba japonica 'Golden King'</b>	Large leaved evergreen with brightly golden splashed leaves. There is no other large evergreen shrub capable of growing in dense shade even under large trees.	<b>£10.00</b>

<b>Aucuba japonica 'Picturata'</b>	As above but leaves have a bright gold solid centre blotch.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Beesia calthifolia</b>	Handsome glossy heart-shaped leaves with deep silvery veins and starry white flowers on this rare shade loving perennial from China. Evergreen in milder areas. To 2ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Belamcanda chinensis - Blackberry Lily</b>	<i>Syn. Iris domestica.</i> Eyecatching large orange flowers speckled deep red , give way to large seed pods that split to reveal glistening black seeds. Swordlike grey-green leaves. Sheltered site. 18 ins to 3ft.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Berberis thunbergii 'Red Chief'</b>	Big bold Berberis with arching stems and deep purple foliage. Tough and hardy. To 6ft but may be pruned.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Betula - Birch</b>	A group of trees grown for their graceful habit and decorative bark, which is often peeling. Grows well on most soils including clay - avoid shallow soil over chalk.	
<b>Betula pendula 'Purpurea'</b>	Upright habit with dark purple leaves. As the stem develops the foliage contrast well with white bark.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Betula pendula 'Tristis'</b>	Good form with an upright leader and semi-pendulous branches. Very elegant. White bark.	<b>£30.00</b>
<b>Billardiera longiflora 'Cherry Berry'</b>	Pendant bell-shaped pale green flowers followed by deep purple-blue berries. Climber for a sheltered site.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Blechnum chilense</b>	Unique Fern, rarely available. Stiffly upright deep green fronds can be up to 5ft. Tough and tolerant of shade or some sun. Runs a little to form ground cover. Best results on deep loamy soil.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Briza media 'Golden Bee' - Quaking Grass</b>	As below. A new form with golden flowers. Very beautiful. 18 inches. Evergreen and does not like cutting back hard in the Spring.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Briza media 'Limouzi' - Quaking Grass</b>	Endearingly beautiful perennial grass, flowers with masses of little heart-shaped green lockets with a purple tinge in summer. Clump forming, does not run. 18ins.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Brunnera macrophylla 'Silver Heart'</b>	Sprays of blue flowers in spring are followed by large heart-shaped leaves which are almost all silver. Part shade and well drained soil.	<b>£8.50</b>
<b>Buddleja colvilei 'Kewensis'</b>	The largest flowers of any Buddleja. Deep red-purple. To 10ft.	<b>£12.50</b>
<b>Bulbinella hookeri</b>	Clumps of narrow green foliage and poker like orange-yellow flowers held well above the foliage in summer. Sun or part shade and well drained soil. Front of border. To 12ins.	<b>£6.50</b>
<b>Bupleurum fruticosum</b>	Evergreen shrub covered with acid yellow umbels midsummer onwards. Blue-green shiny foliage. Seaside plant, bushy shrub up to 3ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Buxus sempervirens 'Longifolia'</b>	A form of the Common Box; dark green narrowly-oblong leaves. Pendulous branches. Very effective trained as a small tree.	<b>£12.75</b> <b>larger plants</b> <b>£20.00</b>

<b>Calliandra surinamensis</b>	Acacia relative from S. America. Numerous pink powder puff flowers appear down the branches. Foliage is finely cut pinnate and evergreen. Will survive light frost but best grown as a container plant and taken in for winter.	<b>£25.00</b>
<b>Callicarpa japonica - Japanese Beautyberry</b>	Masses of bright purple berries in autumn and early winter. Unusual shrub , hardy and easily grown. 6-7ft.	<b>£24.50</b>
<b>Caltha palustris ssp polypetala</b>	A larger form of Marsh Marigold for stream and pond sides, or any fairly wet location. Vigorous , shining green plant with rounded, crenate leaves and golden flowers, 8-10 cm across. Flowers March to May. If grown by water will reach out floating on the surface for 3ft or more from the bank.	<b>£7.50</b>
<b>Calycanthus x raulstonii 'Hartlage Wine'</b>	Exciting new shrub with large, lightly scented, wine coloured flowers over lush oval leaves all through summer. Sun or part shade. To 12ft.	<b>£20.00</b>
<b>Calystegia hederacea 'Flore Pleno'</b>	Double form of Japanese Bindweed. Large flesh coloured Camellia-like flowers with densely set ruffled petals. Twining climber with attractive narrow sagitate leaves. Probably best grown in a tub to restrict its wandering roots. 4ft.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Canna Tropicana 'Black'</b>	Striking almost black foliage and strong spikes of red flowers. To 6ft if in rich soil. Cut down and lift for winter.	<b>£10.00</b>
<b>Carex - Sedge</b>	A diverse family of grass-like evergreen, rhizomatous perennials which grow in dense tufts.	
<b>Carex elata 'Aurea' (Carex stricta 'Aurea') AGM - Bowles Golden Grass</b>	Not to be confused with <i>Milium effusum 'Aureum'</i> which also shares this name. Arching leaves are a deep warm golden yellow, especially bright in early summer. Plant in sun where the soil does not dry out. 2ft .	<b>£7.50</b>

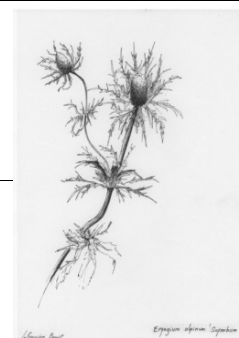


